These are current route discussions to help you prepare your questions. They are not job offers, confirmed vacancies, work-permit confirmation, or visa eligibility decisions.

PORTUGAL

Farm Worker / General Agri-Logistics

Agricultural work, product packing and logistics duties may be discussed. Some practical support tasks can be part of the final employer assignment.

- **Age guide:** 18-50 years
- **Passport:** two or more years remaining recommended
- **Preparation guide:** around 2-3 months

POLAND

Production Line & Warehouse Operations

Production Line Worker and Warehouse Operations Worker are the roles currently being discussed for this route.

- **Locations currently mentioned:** Lodz, Wroclaw and Katowice
- **Age guide:** up to 50; 24 months passport validity recommended
- **Processing guide:** around 4-7 months

Industrial Electrician is currently on hold for verification.

Agriculture and seasonal

Practical roles that may be relevant for people with the right profile.

- Farm and greenhouse work
- Fruit and vegetable work
- Seasonal support

Hospitality and support

Service-oriented work may have different skills and language expectations.

- Hotel assistance
- Housekeeping
- Laundry or kitchen support

03

Construction and trades

Discuss practical experience, safety expectations, and any role-specific requirements.

- Construction helper
- General trade support
- Housing project work

04

Warehouse and production

Explore categories only after your experience, profile, and current availability are reviewed.

- Warehouse support
- Packaging operator
- Assembly or food production

Countries shown on the website are starting points for discussion, not confirmation of an opportunity. A destination can only be explored after the route and individual profile are reviewed.

Questions worth asking

A responsible work conversation should make the following points clear before you rely on the route being discussed.

01 Is the route realistic for my profile?

Discuss your practical experience, qualifications, language, documents, and destination preference honestly.

02 What information can be confirmed?

Ask what is known about the role, employer, location, and next step - and what still requires checking.

03 Why is each document requested?

Understand what information may be needed, why it matters, and when it may be appropriate to share it.

04 Who makes each decision?

Employers and public authorities make their own decisions. Migrate EU does not issue work permits or guarantee jobs or visas.

05 Can I take time before continuing?

Yes. Ask questions, review written information, and decide at your own pace without pressure.
